Messiah Council

May Council meeting highlights (other items will be included throughout the newsletter):

- In-person worship resumed on May 30, Confirmation Sunday (thanks be to God). Saskatchewan Health Authority public health orders include a maximum of 30% of capacity in the Messiah sanctuary (70 people), physical distancing, wearing of masks (singing now allowed, and hand sanitizing). Pre-registration is encouraged by phoning or mailing the Messiah office.
- On-line services continue with live streaming beginning at 10:30am each Sunday; and recorded services available through the Messiah YouTube channel.
- We will continue with only one element (bread or wafer) for the summer months for Holy Communion.
- Messiah's annual Kinasao Sunday is on June 27. A Messiah service will be provided on-line beginning at 10:30am that day for those who are not able to attend at Kinasao.
- Finalizing the recruitment plan for office support.
- A planning meeting will be held in August regarding the Campus Ministry (SKPolyTech and University of Saskatchewan) program and Stephen Ministry training.
- Service planning during Pastor Fran's vacation in July – lay led with sermons provided by the National and Synod Bishops/Assistants to the Bishops summer sermon series.

Messiah's Annual General Meeting was held on Sunday, June 6, with 16 members in attendance. Printed copies of the Annual Report are available by contacting the Messiah office. The Constitution/Bylaw amendments were approved. Randi Arnot was elected to Messiah Council; with thanks expressed to departing members Lois Manchur, Donna Meyers and Darren Sundbo.

The Saskatchewan Synod Convention was held on June 4 and 5. The minutes will be available on the Synod website.

Council meets next on Tuesday, June 22. If you have any matters for consideration by Council, please forward them by phone or email.

Thank you for your continued generosity of spirit, relationship, finance and community such as volunteering to assist with worship services; working with ministry teams; staying in touch with others in our congregation through a phone call or email; and your financial contributions to support Messiah's ministry.

Farewell but not goodbye to Donna. We wish Donna the very best on her retirement, with thanks for her years of faithful service as Messiah's Administrative Assistant. We're happy that Donna will continue to worship and be part of the Messiah congregational family. Worship Notes-June 2021

Worship is In-Person and Still Online

We are so pleased to welcome everyone to worship in person on Sunday mornings at 10:30 a.m. We will continue to live-stream our Worship Services on our YouTube channel, with links provided on our web-site & Facebook pages by 1 pm. every Sunday.

In keeping with provincial health guidelines and the recommendation from the Saskatchewan Synod, we will continue to ask those wishing to attend service to pre-register, to wear a mask, hand sanitize, and maintain a physical distance (6 feet) with others who are not in your bubble. This may change over the summer as guidelines continue to change.

Special Notes:

June 20th we will give thanks for and say farewell to Donna Deobald as she retires as Administrative Assistant from Messiah. There will be a reading and prayers as part of a "Farewell and Godspeed" during the worship service. All are welcome. A celebration with cake and coffee will take place at a later date.


Holy Communion



Celebration of Holy Communion over the summer will be in the form of one element only: bread or gluten-free wafer. You may commune with us as we live-stream service, too. If you wish to partake in communion at home, you are invited to create a special place at your table and perhaps use a special table cloth, plate and cup. You can have the elements prepared ahead of service: bread (gluten-free wafer) and red wine (or grape juice). You may wish to light a candle as the service begins. If you do not wish to partake at home, then know that God is with you, as you hear the words of promise and faith in the Eucharistic Prayer and the Words of Institution.


