From the Pastor's desk - June 2022

"To everything there is a season and a time for every purpose under heaven...." Ecclesiastes 3:1

The more the years pass, the truer these verses from Ecclesiastes become. God provides a season for everything. And this is a time for good-byes and gratitude.

First, there is a time for good-byes. It is hard to say good-bye. Ministry with you was significant. We journeyed through a difficult time, navigating so much disruption and change, during Covid. There were losses and griefs that we could not have anticipated. So much was taken away at the beginning of our ministry together. And ministry unfolded in unexpected ways: online worship services; Zoom Sunday School, bible study, meetings, coffee visits, and confirmation. And these connections and interactions were made meaningful by the One who makes us one however it is that we gather in Jesus' name.

There is a time to share gratitude. I am grateful to all of you for your warm welcome and gracious hospitality over these years. Covid changed some of the natural ways this could be extended but it was felt and offered, when possible. I am thankful to Church Council for their strong leadership and guidance as we navigated various health guidelines and protocols, for walking alongside in supportive ways in our ministry together. And to the members who welcomed me into your hearts, who allowed me the privilege of being your pastor, I am immeasurably grateful for this honour.

In this season of endings and changes, there is also a time for new beginnings and for discernment about ministry directions, to have conversation about who you are as a congregation now in the midst of the changing landscape of what it means to be church. God is at the centre of what stays the same and of what new directions and visions are yet to be discovered. God provides a time for this exploration, and it is good.

As I prepare to leave you, I ask your forgiveness for any harmful words that were spoken or misunderstandings there may have been between us. I confess that I am not perfect, I am a sinner, I have made mistakes along the way, and I left some things undone. And for this, I ask your forgiveness.

A last word on pastoral boundaries. I have already been asked about returning for funerals or pastoral care. This speaks to the depth of relationships that have been formed and while honoured at these requests, I do need to relinquish my pastoral role among you in order to give space to the one who will follow me. Not only will I be serving another parish, but it is also necessary and appropriate to only offer pastoral ministry with the permission of the presiding minister of Messiah. With these healthy boundaries, you will welcome your new minister and give him or her the fullest opportunities to minister to, and with, you. And you will build a relationship and connection with that minister. While these boundaries are difficult to understand, they are done to honour you and to honour our time together as pastor and congregation. And you are free to love your new pastor with the same love you gave to me.

A prayer as my ministry with you ends: O God of all that is, you are with us in every season, and you give a purpose to everything. Guide us day by day, sustain us, and inspire us by your Holy Spirit, to follow you in all that will unfold in the months after Pastor Fran's ministry with us ends. Grant us wisdom and guide the next steps. Remind us that we are not alone but that you journey with us every step of the way. For this, we give you thanks and praise forever! Amen.

While we would love to host a potluck gathering prior to her departure, that is not to be. However, we will have a celebration cake at Kinasao following the June 12 worship service.


